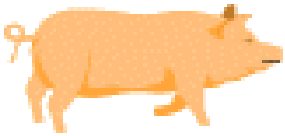

letter from the director

Dear Friends Of Happy Trails,

This issue is somewhat unique in that we are presenting the financial obstacles Happy Trails faces daily and an assortment of ways that you can help make a difference for the rescued animals at Happy Trails.

Contrary to what you may assume, Happy Trails gets no government funding and most grants that we receive are normally for a very specific project.

This leaves an extraordinary amount of expenses that we have to cover ourselves — critical expenses such as grain, hay and straw for the animals (their food and bedding); medical and veterinary expenses for sick, injured or emaciated animals, as well as daily medications for many of the animals to treat the lingering effects of abuse; and a small staff to handle their daily care and medical treatment. And then there are our daily operating costs, costs that are “boring” but required for the sanctuary to survive and operate regularly — costs such as new tires for the skid steer, the purchase of heat lamps and bulbs for many of the shelters for winter; repairing old, wind-damaged fencing that is currently held up by metal stakes; or making our monthly payments on farm equipment.

I encourage you to read this newsletter in the spirit of finding a way to become a part of the solution to addressing the difficult topic of animal abuse and to find a way to help Happy Trails not only achieve our goals, but to survive daily in our mission.

How to start helping? Maybe you and your co-workers would take up a collection for a specific need from our wish list. Perhaps your 4-H club, rotary club, horseman’s group or special interest organization would like to choose a need and gather donations. How about getting your favorite bar or restaurant involved in saving aluminum cans for our recycle program? Or maybe your class at school would like to sponsor a rescued animal and have a Happy Trails representative come to your class to talk to you about that animal and the rescue work and outreach programs of Happy Trails.

Being able to pay for all of the needs of Happy Trails, along with providing top notch care for the animals, is at the top of our list of importance.

This invaluable service that Happy Trails provides to our communities does not cost your county or state anything. We do this because many counties cannot, or would choose not to, use the rescue, rehab and adoption services of Happy

(But we're trying to 'stuff the barn', not our cheeks!)

Sure! C'mon in! We can help you out here at Happy Trails!



Ya'll got any hay or a dry place to lie down over there? I'm hungry and cold!

It's going to be a tough winter, or so we've heard, from many reliable sources. This spring and summer the weather played havoc with hay and straw crops this year, and the rumors are flying that **both feed and bedding are going to be hard to find**. Prices are expected to go through the roof.

With this expected shortage, we are anticipating a busy winter ahead **with many animal cruelty and neglect cases**. To prepare, we are storing up enough hay and straw to get Happy Trails through winter and into next spring. We would love to be in the position to also be able to reach out to others who will struggling. But we need your help.

Our goal is to "stuff" a storage barn to the top with hay and straw, so that we can not only feed and provide bedding for the rescued animals at Happy Trails this winter, but **also prevent potential cases of neglect by being a source for people in need when they have no other options**.

Please consider helping us feed the rescued farm animals throughout the cold weather and help us provide them with warm, dry bedding.

The average price of a square bale of hay or straw is currently about \$4. Choose how many bales you want to "stuff" in the barn, and we'll be happy to do the shopping *(and lifting!)* for you. **Food and dry bedding are necessities, not luxuries**. Thank you for helping us provide the basics!

A \$40 donation will care for the rescued animals for an entire shift!

The Happy Trails Animal Care Giver staff consists of dedicated, knowledgeable people who work outdoors in all sorts of weather and who go above and beyond the call of duty to make sure that the rescued animals are well cared for at Happy Trails.

During our miserably hot summer days, our Animal Care Givers would arrive in our office to sign out, shirts completely soaked with sweat, dirt, mud, feathers, fur, and a few other unmentionable things.

When thunderstorms hit with lightening and pelting rain, you can find our Care Givers scurrying from shelter to shelter to make sure the animals are safe, fed and recovering well.

And as the quickly dropping fall temperatures will soon be leading into single-digit numbers as winter works its way into Northeast Ohio, we will see only the eyes of our Care Givers as they peer out between layers and layers of scarves. They will be squinting through the icy, blinding snow to haul water buckets and food to animals recovering from abuse and neglect situations.

It currently takes about four hours, twice a day, to provide the proper feed, grain and hay; to give clean, fresh water; to turn out or put away horses; to provide medications and dress wounds, and to attend to any other basic care needs of the rescued animals.

A donation of \$10 will provide an hour's worth of care for the animals. A donation of \$40 will provide an entire shift,

four hours, of complete care for the animals.

Our Animal Care Giver staff does not have the luxury of working in an air-conditioned office in the summer or a heated shelter in winter. Soon frozen fingers from digging ice out of water buckets and frozen toes from spilling water down their boots will be a daily occurrence.

However, be assured that though our Care Givers may be cold and uncomfortable, they are determined to keep the rescued animals safe, warm, dry, well fed and comfortable.

Please consider helping us fund our dedicated, hard working Animal Care Givers to ensure top quality care for animals who arrive at Happy Trails suffering from abuse, neglect and abandonment situations.

If you'd like to see how challenging farm animal care can be during the weather and temperature extremes, we encourage you to sign up to "shadow" a staff member during a four hours feeding shift. We're serious about this. Hearing about their work is one thing — to experience it in person during extreme weather is quite another.

If you'd like to help us care for the animals in person during an icy rainstorm or a blizzard dropping eight inches of snow on the ground, please call us at 330-296-5914.

If, instead, you'd like to donate \$10 to help us fund an hour of care and let someone else's toes and fingers go numb, fill out the form on the right. We, and all the animals, will be forever grateful for your support!

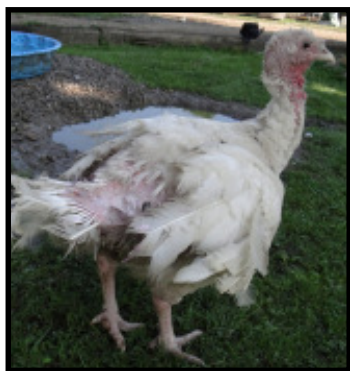

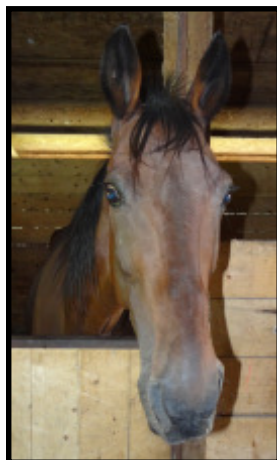

Happy Trails recycles all aluminum, such as pop (and beer!) cans. We also collect used ink



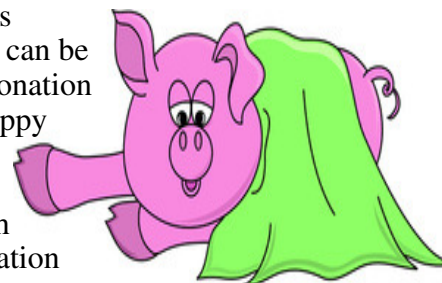

But we have finally received the blessing of the EPA, the health department, and are now in the process of having the engineer design the structure. We do plan for it to be completed before winter.

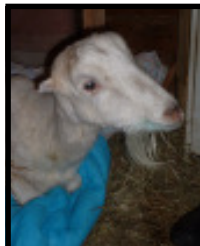

Abandoned in a parking lot...

He's all personality! This little man was abandoned in the busy, dangerous parking lot of a grocery store and left to fend for himself. Alone. Scared. Hungry. Confused.

The number of abandoned animal calls that we receive are disturbing.

Sgt. Pepper was rescued by local authorities and brought to Happy Trails. He has been neutered, vaccinated, dewormed, and now, even housebroken! (Yes he is a great indoor pig!) *And* he is now ready to be adopted! Sgt. Pepper would do best in a household with no dogs, and where someone is home most of the time.

Sgt. Pepper is just one of many pot belly pigs at Happy Trails in need of a permanent home. *Can't adopt?* Donate towards the care of the rescued animals — see inside back cover for details.

Our Mission

Happy Trails Farm Animal Sanctuary Inc. is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization that rescues, rehabilitates, and provides an adoption program for abused, abandoned, and neglected farm animals such as horses, ponies, potbelly pigs, farm pigs, chickens, ducks, turkeys, sheep, goats, and cows. Happy Trails serves the entire state of Ohio and surrounding states, and works in cooperation with county humane societies, animal protective leagues, and local and state law enforcement officers. Animals in our program must have been removed from a situation of abuse, neglect or abandonment by law officials, and cruelty charges must be filed against the person(s) responsible for the crime.
