

Happy Trails new storage barn for sawdust, hay and straw is 24' wide x 32' long.

It is 17' high in the front to allow the dump truck to back into the opening and dump a load of sawdust easily and safely.

This building is being built by all volunteers.

We purchased \$4,700 worth of lumber, metal siding and metal roofing. We spent an additional \$400 on special boards that go around the bottom of the building to keep it from rotting; cement to go in the holes to set the posts; nails and other misc. hardware supplies.

We expect to have the remainder of the storage building completed this weekend. This building should allow us to store many months worth of bedding and hay for the rescued animals. This will save us precious financial resources during winter months when hay and straw prices sky-rocket and these necessities are a challenge to find, let alone find at reasonable prices.

So far our total cost in materials is \$5,100. This does not include having cement poured for the floor. We are hoping to find a supporter who may be willing to help out with a donation of a cement floor for this pole barn.
